The Andrew Family Foundation is soliciting applications for Opportunity Knocks, a grant program seeking partnerships with organizations and individuals to improve the lives of low-income and disadvantaged youth in Arizona, Florida, Illinois, Nevada, and Texas. Up to \$450,000 over three years will be awarded to start new programs or build upon existing ones that include educational, mentoring, and opportunities to foster a better future and healthier community for residents. Eligibility is restricted to 501(c)3 nonprofit organizations with an operating budget of less than \$2 million per year, with 50 percent or less of funding coming from government sources.
